- of mobile and on-site resocialization,
- of victim protection and a sustainable victim-oriented criminal justice system, and
- alternative paths and strategies in the development of restorative justice, which establishes new approaches to accepting responsibility and making amends.

These processes require constant further development and adaptation to new findings in the accompanying sciences. At the same time, it must be noted that the scientific findings developed to date have still been integrated only hesitantly into police and judicial practice, investigative, criminal and correctional procedures, and committed release management. The new series of publications of the program Edition Seehaus [Plus] shall therefore

- with empirical, theoretical and applied essays with a scientific character as well as reports from practice
- reports from practice, problem outlines, project descriptions as well as programmatic or conceptual
- programmatic or conceptual contributions from the fields of criminology, criminal law and penal practice.
